

Mr. Brennan, please see our questions as they pertain to the recent RFI for the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division RFI for a replacement licensing system. We look forward to responding to the RFI. Thanks.

First off, thank you for your questions. Just a heads-up.....Fire Marshal is spelled with one "L" ..... Not Marshall 😊

- 1) The Nevada State Fire Marshall Division has indicated that they are currently using GL Solutions and have been since 2002. Can the (NSFMD) disclose the original cost of the GL Solution Licensing system along with ongoing annual maintenance or supports costs?

At this time no. This program was purchased originally as a COTS and installed on a single desktop system, awaiting for the State IT to set-up a server just for this system. Because of building infrastructure at the time this never occurred. Around 2005, we contracted with GL Solutions to take our program and make it web-based and the data is stored at their location in Bend, Oregon.

- 2) Has the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division participated in any potential vendor presentations or product overviews in the last 12 months? If so who were the potential vendor that may be responding to the RFI?

No. This is the first time we have solicited new vendors for this program since 2002.

- 3) Has the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division received any price quotes or estimates in the last 12 month for a replacement licensing system from a potential vendor? If so who was the vendor and what costs or estimates were given?

No. This is the first time we have solicited new vendors for this program since 2002.

- 4) Does the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division have a budget for the product? Implementation Cost? Ongoing Support Costs?

No. Once we have solicited information from all vendors, we will select the vendors that look most likely to succeed in designing a system we can utilize and send them a Request for Proposal. At that time we will get an idea of the budget that we will be working with. At this point we have no firm numbers, but the Department of Public Safety and State Legislature set the cap for all of the Fire Marshal Divisions programs.

- 4) Does the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division have an timeline for completion of the replacement licensing system?

We will need to get a program in place as quickly as possible as our contract runs out in June 2019. We have a possibility if the previous vendor agrees to extend for a 1 year maintenance agreement while the new system is tested and we are in transition.

- 5) What would the contract length be for the awarded vendor? 3 Years? 5 Years? 7 years etc.?

Normal contracts run for 4 years. Nevada Legislature sits every two years on odd numbered years, the next session begins February 2019 and runs normally through May 2019. Nevada's Fiscal Years run July 1<sup>st</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>.

- 6) Can the Nevada State Fire Marshall Division provide Exhibit A – Vendor Response Form and Exhibit B – Cost Planning Information Sheet in a word format for the vendors to fill out. The document is currently in a PDF format.
